





This Sunday, November 28th, is the first Sunday of Advent, in which the focus is on HOPE. The scripture is Luke 21:25-36, in which Jesus predicts all the signs associated with the coming of the Son of Man (or the "Human One") and the establishment of the kingdom of God on earth. The sermon is entitled, "Testifying to Hope." In Advent, we hope for a more humane future. The painting here, entitled "Hope," is one I did in preparation for today's worship.

Crossan's method is to situate biblical texts within the reconstructed matrix of their own their own genre and purpose, their own time and place, and to hear them accurately for then before accepting or rejecting them for now.*

## **The Puppets Are Coming! The Puppets Are Coming!**

The Colossal Puppets have been released from quarantine and are making their way east from St. Michael's Parish in Litchfield to tell the wondrous story of the nativity. They will join us for worship on Sunday, December 12th. It's been two years since they have ventured out, and they are anxious to share the good news with us all.

They could use some help getting ready for the event. If you are available for a couple of hours on the afternoon of December 7th, you can help us get them ready for the Sunday service. No prior experience is required. As long as you can follow our instructions, we can get them set up and dressed for the occasion.

We will need 11 volunteers on Sunday, December 12th, to operate the puppets during the worship service. There will be one rehearsal on Saturday, December 11th, at 10 am in the Meeting House. The rehearsal should not last longer than 90 minutes. Again, no prior experience is required, but you will need to be able to hold a 10' high pole. The puppets are not heavy, but they are a little cumbersome and require getting used to them.

Finally, on Monday morning, December 13th, we will again need some assistance for a couple of hours to disassemble the puppets and pack them for their return trip to Litchfield.

We named ourselves "Welcome Home West Hartford." We are back, and are organizing now in order to respond to a new international crisis.

Afghan families are fleeing their country, and many are coming to Connecticut. *Welcome Home West Hartford* needs your help to resettle one of these families.

Here is how you can help:

- 1) Support us with your contributions. We will need to raise \$10,000 within the next few months.
- 2) Donate nice, used, furniture, appliances, or other necessities to furnish an apartment.
- 3) Join the planning team and take on a major responsibility, such as finding housing, preparing a first meal, or gathering furnishings.
- 4) Sign up to be an occasional helper with driving or babysitting types of tasks.
