## Looking Towards Sunday

Instead, Jesus implored people to think and act boldly with their money and belongings, to show radical generosity and extravagant love for their neighbors. In this week's scripture, the story of the rich man and Lazarus, Jesus turns upside down cultural norms concerning wealth. The powerful are weak, and the weak are powerful.
