## **Looking Towards Sunday**

This Sunday is All Saints Day-- a moment of remembering all those in "the company of heaven". All Saints' Day goes back to the fourth century when the Christians celebrated a festival on the first Sunday after Pentecost to honor all martyrs and saints. Pope Gregory IV made All Saints' Day a church holiday in 837 CE-- replacing the pagan Festival of the Dead.

All Saints' Day is linked with Halloween or "All Hallows' Eve".


Interesting facts about All Saints Day:

- · All Saints' Day is not the same as All Souls' Day. All Souls' Day is dedicated to those who still have not reached heaven.
- · Hymns like "For All the Saints" and "I Sing a Song of the Saints of God" are traditionally sung.
- The football team New Orleans Saints got its name from the dominant Catholic population in the state.
- In an All Saints' Day feast, soul cakes and Irish bread with fruit are commonly served.

## RISE & SHINE --- It's Breakfast at Church! Next Sunday!


November 6th from 8:30-9:45 a.m. in the Auditorium

#### October Reach Out: Freshplace

"Freshplace is an innovative client-choice/fresh food/case management food pantry. Freshplace at Chrysalis Center serves up to 100 families living in the poorest neighborhoods in the North End of Hartford. Freshplace's mission is to build long-term food security and self-sufficiency by providing individuals with access to fresh and nutritional foods and case management services to address both the immediate need of hunger and the root causes of food insecurity – poverty. After reaching their individualized goals, Freshplace members have a better chance of eliminating hunger in their household and increasing their family's economic self-sufficiency."

Freshplace provides at-risk families with fresh fruits, vegetables, meat, and dairy products in addition to pantry staples. Clients are guided in making selections that accommodate their health, cultural, religious, and familial needs. There are also comprehensive intake and referral services, increasing access to food stamps, health and crisis intervention programs, public assistance, and educational services.
