Donated diapers make a difference! Please consider donating to our October Diaper Drive!

Diapers can take a big chunk out of a family's budget costing on average \$70-\$80 a month and the costs are not covered by WIC or SNAP benefits. All size diapers and wipes are needed but particularly Pull-Ups and diapers in sizes 4,5,6. From October 1 through October 29, Outreach is collecting diapers, baby wipes and Pull--Ups to be distributed through the Bridge Family Resource Center at Charter Oak International Academy and their Mosaic Family Center in Hartford. Please drop in the marked boxes at church entrances.

First Church is looking to fill an Assistant Director of Worship Arts for our music program. This position will work as an assistant to our Director of Worship Arts, learning the aspects of church music leadership as an apprentice. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to experience leading church music by participating in our church choir during the year. One Sunday a month, they will have the opportunity to lead a worship service by playing service music, accompanying hymns, preparing the choir, and conducting the choir during worship.
