Update from the First Church Academy Workgroup

In April of this year, our Coordinating Team, led by Moderator Wendy Wigglesworth, convened a work group to examine the relationship between the church and the First Church Academy for Young Children. The members of the work group were: Suzanne Carnes, Chair; Jenny Clark, Co-Chair; Diane Bohman; Linda Lacasse; Dawne Quinn, Lisa Reed, and Jim Warner.

Our charge from the Coordinating Team was to "discern the pros and cons of a legal separation of the Academy from the church" as its own entity.

After consulting with several church leaders, staff members, our insurance provider and three attorneys, we completed our work in October. The final report was sent to the Business Team, which in turn presented it to the Coordinating Team. Our unanimous decision was that the First Church Academy should remain as part of First Church.
