## Looking Towards Sunday

"Then [Jesus] said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.'" – John 20:27

## Friends:

The inset image is a digital rendering of Caravaggio's masterpiece entitled The Incredulity of Saint Thomas (1603). Which depicts the apostle's hand being guided by Christ's hand to inspect his crucifixion wounds. Incredulity, you might recall, is one of the ingredients of Easter joy. Incredulity says, "I can't believe what's right in front of me even though it's right in front of me." It tastes like doubt but it's not doubt. It has the same texture as suspicion but it's not suspicion. It's wonder...as in: "I wonder if God had a hand in this?!"



My point in repeating what I said last Sunday is that the inability to conceive of the Resurrection is common to the enterprise of faith. The fact that one apostle has had to wear the moniker "Doubting Thomas" in perpetuity has always struck me as an injustice since most of us would have struggled in the same way to make sense of the Savior's appearance.

So, can I encourage you to cease and desist any misconceptions you might have about Thomas? Instead, let's examine the episode (John 20:19-31) with open minds. I think it provides an important clue about how to deal with disbelief. I'll say more when I see you. The sermon is entitled: The Acquittal of Thomas the Twin.

### April Reach Out: Journey Home

Journey Home has spent more than a decade committed to ending chronic homelessness in the Greater Hartford region. They have been able in less than two years to match 72% of those experiencing chronic homelessness to housing, which means they have been housed or will be housed very soon.

A Hand Up, a program of Journey Home, works to support those who are currently transitioning from homelessness to housing by connecting them to donations of household goods and furniture. Together they are filling a huge gap because clients are often moving into housing after experiencing homelessness with nothing but what they can carry on their back. Yet, many people have excess furniture and household items in their homes without a place to put them other than the landfills. Together with your support they will be able to end homelessness.
